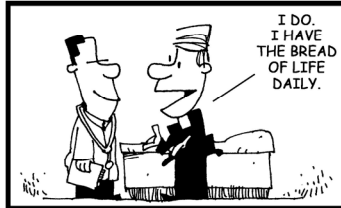
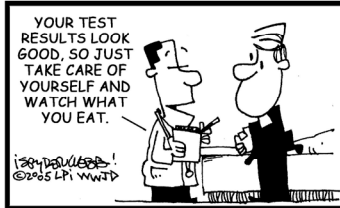

The more popular name for today's Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is Corpus Christi, which of course in Latin means the "Body of Christ." The Church has celebrated this feast at this time since it was proclaimed by Pope Urban IV in 1264. We are asked on this day to concentrate on two expressions of the Body of Christ — the Holy Eucharist and the Church itself. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#1327) states the importance of the Eucharist quite succinctly and directly: "In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith." At the center of every Mass is our celebration of the Eucharist. The word "Eucharist" comes from the Greek word *eucharistia* which means "thanksgiving." It is through the Eucharist which we receive the Lord's greatest gift to us, and it should be in thanksgiving and delight which we receive it. This holy day should also remind us of all those things for which we should be thankful. Gratitude is at the basis of a life of stewardship. It is through thanksgiving for all we have received, especially the Holy Body and Blood of Christ through the Eucharist, that we find the motivation and the commitment to be good



stewards. The Pontiff Emeritus Benedict XVI in one of his writings spoke of the Eucharist in this way: "In the Eucharist a communion takes place that corresponds to the union of man and woman in marriage. Just as they become 'one flesh,' so in the Eucharist we all become 'one spirit,' one person with Christ." Today we thank God for the incredible gift to us of the Eucharist. St. Madeleine Sophie Barat (May 29th) The legacy of Madeleine Sophie Barat can be found in the more than 100 schools operated by her Society of the Sacred Heart, institutions known for the quality of the education made available to the young. Sophie herself received an extensive education, thanks to her brother, Louis, 11 years older and her godfather at Baptism. Himself a seminarian, he decided that his younger sister would likewise learn Latin, Greek, history, physics and mathematics—always without interruption and with a minimum of companionship. By age 15, she had received a thorough exposure to the Bible, the teachings of the Fathers of the Church and theology. Despite the oppressive regime Louis imposed, young Sophie thrived and developed a genuine love of learning. Meanwhile, this was the time of the French Revolution and of the suppression of Christian schools. The education of the young, particularly young girls, was in a troubled state. At the same time, Sophie, who had concluded that she was called to the religious life, was persuaded to begin her life as a nun and as a teacher. She founded the Society of the Sacred Heart, which would focus on schools for the poor as well as boarding schools for young women of means; today, co-ed Sacred Heart schools can be found as well as schools exclusively for boys. In 1826, her Society of the Sacred Heart received formal papal approval. By then she had served as superior at a number of convents. In 1865, she was stricken with paralysis; she died that year on the feast of the Ascension. Madeleine Sophie Barat was canonized in 1925. (from <http://www.americancatholic.org>)

El Aborto y la Economía (Parte 1).

Los niños son nuestro mayor recurso natural. Sin embargo, a través del mundo oeste, la natalidad ha decaído. En Europa, los principales países tales como Alemania, Italia, Francia, Grecia y la Gran Bretaña, en su totalidad tienen índices de natalidad (TFR o niños por mujer) bien abajo de 1.5.



El índice de natalidad del Japón está al fondo con 1.1 debido a su política de "un solo niño." El índice de natalidad de la China también oscila entre 1.5 y sus problemas futuros sin lugar a dudas se complicaran por el desequilibrio de género (ocasionado por abortos selectivos). Los países tienen un futuro incierto cuando la natalidad desciende tanto. Económicamente, los problemas son obvios. Los gobiernos en Europa y Norte América han construido estados elaborados y con derechos generosos desde la Segunda Guerra Mundial. Pero la población que avejenta y la pirámide invertida demográfica ponen una enorme responsabilidad en la juventud, causando significativa y al final presiones catastróficas en la bolsa pública. Nada más los Estados Unidos tiene \$100 trillones de deuda pública.
